This manual contains information regarding the correct use and maintenance of your MUVI. For your security and comfort, we recommend you read these instructions carefully.







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Owner's Manual INTRODUCTION



The first lightweight electric scooter designed to move you from here to there in a breeze: it's easy to ride and very comfortable. It comes with a small space under the seat for a jet helmet, front and rear LED daytime running lights, disc brakes and everything else you need to get around town safely, enjoyably and efficiently. It's extrovert, laid-back design has been created for people like you, who value time and practicality above all else.

Owner's Manual PRE-OPERATION CHECKS

Before riding, check that:

- The charger is disconnected
- The battery has sufficient charge
- The lights and horn work properly, check the headlight, blinkers and brake light.
- The brakes work properly
- The tyres have the correct pressure
- The rear-view mirrors are correctly positioned
- The belt has the correct tension.

CLOTHING

Riding motorcycles has its risks, and prevention is better than cure, so it's best to be protected:

- Always fasten the helmet
- Wear comfortable, snug-fitting clothes. Loose-fitting clothes can complicate manoeuvres and become tangled in the motorbike's parts.
- Wear comfortable, snug-fitting footwear so they don't fall off while riding. Avoid heels that are too high or thongs.

RIDING SAFELY

- Always carry your driving licence and a valid insurance policy
- Always grasp the handlebar with both hands
- Always remain seated, do not stand.
- Always obey traffic signs and police officers
- Do not let an inexperienced person ride your motorbike.

Owner's Manual CONTROLS

1. HIGH AND LOW BEAM

This button lets you switch between high and low beam. You can flash the high beam by pressing the part closest to you.

2. BLINKERS

To signal your intentions on the road you should always use the blinkers before turning. This warns other drivers of your manoeuvre. Move the lever to the left to activate the left blinkers and to the right to activate the right ones. Press the button to deactivate the blinkers.

3. REAR BRAKE - COMBINED BRAKE SYSTEM

To brake using the CBS system, squeeze this lever. This system balance the brake force between rear wheel (main presure) and the front wheel (light braking force).

4. HORN

Press this button to sound the horn. It emits a high tone.

5. DISCONNECTION BUTTON

Move the button to the right to put the motorbike into STOP mode. The motorbike will remain on.

6. FRONT BRAKE

This lever brakes only on the front wheel.

Braking with this breke give a efective and reactive braking force. But if you squeeze the lever forcefully in an abrupt manner the wheel will lock and the motorbike will lose stability. Always squeeze the brake levers gently.

7. ACCELERATOR

Move your wrist downward to rotate the grip and send power to the motor. To keep all components in good condition avoid applying maximum acceleration in an abrupt manner.

8. SET BUTTON

For more information on the SET button read the corresponding page (page 21).

9. IGNITION SWITCH

For more information on the ignition switch read the

Owner's Manual DASHBOARD WARNING LIGHTS AND SYMBOLS



1. BLUETOOTH INDICATOR

This indicator shows if there are any Bluetooth devices connected to the motorbike.

2. TEMPERATURE INDICATOR

Indicates a problem, the temperature is either too high or too low.



HIGH TEMPERATURE

This symbol means that a component has reached a high temperature, resulting in reduced torque and power until the temperature stabilises.



LOW TEMPERATURE

This symbol means the internal battery-pack temperature is below -5°C. Remove the batteries and bring them indoors so they can warm up a little.

3. WARNING

Except for OBD errors, this icon will light up when an error is detected.

4. TRIP

Shows the kilometres travelled since the last time it was reset.

5. RIDING MODE

Shows the mode in which the motorbike is being ridden. There are two modes: ECO and FULL. If while in ECO mode two arrows appear beside ECO, this indicates that FULL mode can be engaged.

6. BATTERY 1

Shows the charge level of battery 1

7. BATTERY 2

Shows the charge level of battery 2

8. TIME

Shows the time

9. SPEED

Shows the travel speed

10. UNITS OF SPEED

Indicates the unit of speed being used. Km/h or MPH.

Owner's Manual DASHBOARD WARNING LIGHTS AND SYMBOLS

11. RANGE

Shows how many kilometres or miles (depending on configuration) can be travelled before running out of battery.

Depending of the type of battery, the aging of it and the style of riding, the range showed on the dashboar may vary.

This is a dynamic value which will vary with time and vehicle use. To calculate the range more accurately, the motorbike takes riding style and usual consumption into account.

12. ODOMETER

Shows the total amount of kilometres or miles travelled by the motorbike (depending on configuration).



13. LOW BATTERY WARNING LIGHT

This light turns on when one of the batteries is below 20%.



14. HIGH BEAM INDICATOR

This light indicates that high beam is on.

15. OBD FAULT WARNING LIGHT

When this light turns on it means the OBD has detected a fault. Executing the diagnostics via the application will tell you more about this fault.

16. BLINKER INDICATOR

When you activate the blinkers this light will blink.

17.POWER

Shows the motorbike's instantaneous power.

18. AVSPD / AVS

Shows the average speed at which the MUVI has been ridden.

19. UNITS OF CONSUMPTION

Shows the average consumption per unit of distance (kilometres or miles depending on which you have set).

Owner's Manual RIDING MODES



ECO

The motorbike starts in this mode by default. This mode is characterised by smooth power delivery, providing maximum reduction of consumption. This allows for a greater range.

This mode is also activated when the motorbike starts with only one battery, when the batteries are unbalanced over 20% and whrn at least one of the batteries are under 20% of charge.

While riding in ECO mode, you can engage FULL mode when two arrows appear beside ECO.

*It is inadvisable to carry a passenger in this mode

FULL

This mode delivers maximum performance and power, which will effect the range.

This riding mode is only available when both batteries are connected and the difference in charge level between them is less than 20%.

When one of the batteries has a lower level than 20%, the low battery warning turns on and ECO mode is activated automatically.

While riding in FULL mode, ECO mode can be engaged when desired.

Owner's Manual IGNITION SWITCH



1. OFF

In this position the motorbike is off, however, the steering is unlocked.

2. ON

In this position the motorbike is on and ready to go, provided it is off its centre stand.

3. LOCK

In this position the motorbike is off and the steering can be locked toward one side or the other. To engage this position, press the key inward then turn.

Owner's Manual START SCREENS

The display will turn on when the key is in the ON position. Depending on whether or not there are initial errors, either of the following images will be displayed. Read each message description to understand its meaning.



The display will show the Torrot logo upon starting the motorbike.



If all is fine this image will be shown, meaning you can start riding.



It will then test that all the components are in working order.



This image means that it's time to take the MUVI for its routine service.

Owner's Manual START SCREENS



One of the motorbike's batteries is below 20% of its capacity.



The temperature of a component is too low. ECO mode will be engaged.



HIGH TEMPERATURE

The temperature of one or more components is too high and ECO mode will be engaged.



INCOMPATIBLE BATTERIES

Two incompatible batteries have been connected. The motorbike will not work.

Owner's Manual START SCREENS



There is an error in one of the batteries. ECO mode will be engaged.



The batteries have unequal charges. ECO mode will be engaged.



BATTERY NOT DETECTED SINGLE BATTERY MODE

Only one battery has been detected. ECO mode will be engaged.



UNABLE TO RUN Please check MUVI APP

The motorbike is unable to run. Check the errors via the application and contact the technical service centre.

Owner's Manual SET BUTTON

The SET button performs three functions:

• When it is possible, it switches the riding mode:

The riding modes, as well as when it is possible to switch between them, have been explained on the previous page. To do this, press the SET button for 1 second. The dashboard will indicate that the mode has changed.

• Resets the kilometres shown on the TRIP meter:

Press the SET button for 3 seconds to reset the kilometres shown on the TRIP meter.

Changes from km/h to mph:

To change from the Metric (km/h) to the Imperial system (mph) simultaneously press the SET button and apply the right brake for 3 to 5 seconds.

SETTING THE TIME

To set the time the motorcycle must be connected to a smartphone via Bluetooth. The time will be synchronised as explained below.

Owner's Manual BLUETOOTH APP

An application has been developed to connect your smartphone to the MUVI.* There is a sticker inside the helmet compartment which has the motorbike's identifier and the PIN number you must enter to establish a connection.





*The smartphone's Bluetooth must be the low energy version (BTLE) to be compatible.

Owner's Manual STORAGE COMPARTMENT

The MUVI's storage compartment is designed to hold a helmet*. To open it, remove the key from the ignition and insert it into the lock on the left side of the motorbike.

The motorbike batteries are also located inside this compartment. Further below there will be a detailed explanation on how to treat the batteries to avoid deterioration and extend their service life as much as possible.





*It must be a jet helmet and there must be only one battery.

Owner's Manual USING THE CENTRE STAND

To put the motorbike onto its centre stand when parking, set the ignition switch to OFF. Place your foot on the stand's arm 1 and push downward. To facilitate this move, grasp the handle with your hand and pull upward.



Owner's Manual USAGE AND PRECAUTIONS

The speed and maximum range can vary depending on the acquired model.

- L3e-A1: 70km/h
- L1e-B: 45km/h

The range will also vary considerably depending on the driving style and conditions under which the MUVI is subjected to, including route gradient, driving aggressiveness, number of passengers, etc

Hydraulic front and rear disc brakes provide easy braking, requiring very little force on the lever. Using the left brake lever activates the combined braking, distributing it over both wheels.

Avoid sudden braking, doing so can cause loss of stability and control, especially on wet or sandy surfaces.

Before using the motorbike at its full potential, familiarise yourself with it and how it responds. Even the most experienced riders can have accidents under bad weather conditions so it is important to always exercise care when riding.



Use the throttle smoothly in order to ride more efficiently.

What should I do at the end of the product lifetime?

The motorbike should be managed using an authorized waste treatment centre. As the KIDS use recyclable materials, the product has a recycling rate greater than 95%.

Furthermore, the fact that the vehicle was easy to disassemble has been stablished as a design requirement in order to make easier the recycling of the materials.

Owner's Manual TURN-ON SEQUENCE

Turning the key to the ON position turns on the motorbike, however, the motor is not yet operational. The display will show a few turn-on check screens and if there are no errors the speedometer will appear with the word STOP. To get to the ECO/FULL screen and activate the motor you will have to:

- 1. Ensure the motorcycle is off its centre stand
- 2. Squeeze one of the two brake levers

Following this sequence stops you from leaving with the stand down and damaging the motorbike. It is also a way of testing the brakes before setting off.



Owner's Manual REMOVING THE BATTERIES

One of the aspects that sets this electric vehicle apart from the rest are its portable batteries that are easily removed, allowing them to be charged where desired.

To remove them make sure the motorbike is stopped, open the storage compartment, loosen the Velcro strap and pull off the battery until it comes out, while pulling off the battery with one hand, grasp it with the other hand to steady it. Each battery weighs about 10 kg.





NEVER REMOVE THE BATTERIES WHILE THE MOTORCYCLE IS ON.

INSERTINGTHE BATTERIES

To insert a battery, line it up with the grooves then gently slide it in until it reaches the bottom. Do not let it drop to the bottom as this can damage the connectors. Once they are in position fasten the Velcro strap.



BE CAREFULLY WHEN INSERTING THE BATTERIES. IT MUST FIT PROPERLY, MATCHING THE CHAMFERS OF EACH BATTERY WITH THE BATTERY CONTAINER ONES.



Owner's Manual CHARGING THE BATTERIES

As the batteries are removable they can be charged either in or out of the motorbike. If the batteries are in the motorbike their charge level can be seen on the display, if not, the top cover has a charge level indicator. Press the button for a few seconds and the LEDs will light up showing the charge level. The dual charger has two outputs, for charging both batteries simultaneously.

To charge them in the motorbike:

- 1 Turn the motorbike off
- 2. Put it onto the centre stand
- 3. Open the storage compartment and connect both batteries to the charger.
- 4. Connect the charger to mains power

The batteries are now charging. If you want to see the remaining charge time insert the key into the ignition switch and turn on the motorbike. The display will show the charge status of each battery and the time remaining.

To charge them off the motorbike:

- 1. Turn the motorbike off
- 2. Remove the batteries as explained on the previous page
- Connect them to the charger
 Connect the charger to mains power

NEVER CONNECT NOR DISCONNECT THE CHARGER FROM THE BATTERY PULLING THE WIRE. APPLY A LOGICAL FORCE TO CONNECT THE CHARGER. IF IT DOESN'T MATCH, REVIEW THE INSERTION POSITION.



ALWAYS CHARGE TO THE LIMIT AFTER EACH **USE. DO NOT DISCONNECT THE CHARGER UNTIL LED2 IS GREEN**

Owner's Manual BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

1. GENERAL

a. The battery comprises lithium ion cells with a high energy density. It must not be tampered with under any circumstances. Failure to observe this instruction entails electrical and chemical risks, which can result in serious material and personal damage.

b. The inspection, repair or replacement of the battery, or any of its elements, by personnel not expressly authorised by the manufacturer is strictly prohibited.

c. The manipulation or repair of any electrical/electronic element of the vehicle (motor, controller, etc.) by personnel not expressly authorised by the manufacturer is strictly prohibited.

d. Each battery has an electronic device that counts the number of days elapsed starting from the moment the charge level goes below 20% (equivalent to the low-battery warning light in the display). The battery warranty will be null and void once this count reaches 40 days.

2. BATTERY DAMAGE

Any type of vehicle abuse can affect the battery's service life. Observe the following instructions to keep it in good condition and prolong its service life:

a. Avoid using the vehicle in conditions of extreme heat or cold that go beyond the limits indicated by the manufacturer.

a. Avoid charging the battery in conditions of extreme heat or cold that go beyond the limits indicated by the manufacturer.

c. When the vehicle is not being used it should be stored in a dry place, away from sources of heat and/or cold, as well as direct sunlight.

d. Avoid unnecessary knocks and vibrations to your vehicle. The insulation between the battery and the vehicle's chassis should be

checked regularly to ensure it is in good condition. If it is not, replace it.

e. Self-discharge is a natural characteristic of the battery and should be monitored. In case of prolonged periods of inactivity, it should be regularly charged to its maximum level.

f. Avoid partially charging the battery. For correct daily use, the battery should always be charged to the limit set by the charger.

g. As a general rule, after charging has finished it is advisable to leave the battery connected to the charger for a certain amount of time.

h. Only use chargers that have been supplied directly by the manufacturer or an authorised dealer.

i. During use, avoid abnormally forcing the vehicle.

j. The battery is equipped with integrated protection against electrical hazards, which can engage automatically. If the battery is not working properly, or at all, have it repaired at an authorised technical service centre.

k. Keep the battery clean and in good condition, carefully remove dust, dirt and other foreign elements that can get into the battery compartment during use.

I. If deterioration is detected in the electrical system's conductors, turn off the vehicle and take it to an authorised Torrot technical service centre.

m. Water, mud or similar must not come into direct contact with the vehicle's electrical system. If water has accidentally entered any of the vehicle's electrical elements, turn it off and wait for it to dry naturally before using it again.

Owner's Manual MAINTENANCE

As with all electric vehicles, the MUVI requires less maintenance than equivalent combustion vehicles. Following, we will address a few maintenance issues that you should carry out.



IF YOUR MOTORBIKE DOES NOT WORK, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO FIX IT YOURSELF AS YOU COULD RISK INJURY OR WORSEN THE PROBLEM. TAKE IT TO AN AUTHORISED WORKSHOP AND WE WILL HAVE IT READY FOR YOU AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.



DO NOT FORGET TO REMOVE THE BATTERIES BEFORE CARRYING OUT MAINTENANCE.

BELT TENSION

The belt tension should be 80-85 Hz. This can be measured with a belt tension gauge. If you lack the required know-how, contact your trusted workshop, or the closest Torrot-authorised one, and have them adjust the belt.

Owner's Manual TYRE PRESSURE

Riding with a tyre pressure different to that recommended can cause inappropriate tyre wear, less surface grip, and consequently, less control over the motorbike which can lead to an accident. Apart from avoiding all this, keeping the tyres at the correct pressure will also prolong their service life. Change the tyres when the tread depth reaches that established by traffic regulations. After changing the tyres make sure both have the same, and correct, pressure.



Owner's Manual BRAKE FLUID

Regularly check the brake fluid level where indicated in the picture. Too low a level can cause deficient braking and lead to an accident. The brake fluid reservoir D has a circular transparent window. The minimum level is situated slightly above the bottom of the window, and the maximum, at the top of the window.



BRAKE CALLIPERS

Check the brake pads regularly to see if the thickness is less than 1mm. If this is the case then have them replaced with new ones.

Owner's Manual ACCESSING THE HEADLIGHT

If you notice the headlight is emitting less light, or none at all, then it needs replacing. To access the light bulb, take off the rear handlebar cover by removing the screws **1** shown in the picture. Once the screws are out, remove the plastic cover by detaching the tabs **P** shown in the picture. Be careful when removing the plastic cover as the ECU is screwed to it. Separate the plastic cover from the motorbike by uncoupling the ECU connector.



Owner's Manual CHANGING THE LIGHT BULB

You now have rear access to the headlight. Start by removing the black rubber protector on the rear of the headlight. Next, uncouple the headlight connector. You will see the bulb retention clip, one of its sides terminates in two ends. Press one of these ends inward then sideward to remove from its position. Do the same with the other end. The light bulb is now loose and can be replaced with a new one.

Reverse this procedure to reassemble the headlight.



Owner's Manual ADJUSTING THE HEADLIGHT

The headlight beam can go askew due to motorcycle use or a bulb change, making adjustment necessary.

A headlight aim check must be performed on level ground with the tyres inflated and a person sitting on the motorbike.

With the motorbike upright and the wheel touching a wall, mark the light bulb's height with respect to the ground. Move back 10 metres perpendicularly from the wall and turn on the headlight.

The highest part of the beam should be 10% under the previous position.

For example: If when touching the wall the light bulb's height is 100cm, when you move back 10 metres, the highest part of the beam should be at 90cm (100*0.9).

To adjust the beam height, loosen or tighten the screw **T** shown on the previous page.



Owner's Manual CLEANING

To prolong the life of the fairings and other components it is important to keep the motorcycle clean. Dust and grime that accumulates on the motorbike's exterior can end up penetrating into its interior, affecting electronic components.

Clean the motorbike with a damp cloth, soapy water or a spray especially for cleaning plastics.

Do not clean with a pressure washer or a hose as water could get into the electronic components.

If you are not going to use the motorbike for a long time remember to follow the instructions regarding the batteries. When storing the motorbike, clean and let it dry, put it onto the stand and cover with a tarpaulin. Regularly check that everything works properly and cover it again.

Owner's Manual STICKER LOCATIONS

Each of the MUVI's components has a sticker that indicates its model and serial number. Let's take a look at where these stickers are.



Owner's Manual VIN NUMBER

The VIN number, or serial number, is engraved on the metal tube that leads to the chassis' steering head. Just beside this is the Manufacturer's Data Plate, which is indelible. It indicates the manufacturer's name as well as the VIN number.



Owner's Manual WARRANTY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Torrot Electric Europa S.A. guarantees to the owner that only the original components of each new Torrot Electric vehicle show no defects in materials, nor in labour during the following specified periods:

Two (2)-year [three (3)-years for Spain & Portugal] warranty on:

- Any original component or part of a Torrot Electric vehicle (KIDS and MUVI).

- MUVI batteries are warrantied for two years [three years for Spain & Portugal] or 40,000 km within this period, as long as the use and maintenance conditions set out in the manual are observed.

- The batteries in our KIDS vehicles, as long as the use and maintenance conditions set out in the manual are observed.

This warranty applies only to Torrot Electric vehicles bought new from an authorized Torrot Electric Europa S.A. dealer or directly from the manufacturer via online and which were assembled by that dealer or the manufacturer at the time of purchase. This warranty does not cover unauthorized parts or parts fitted by companies not explicitly authorized by Torrot Electric Europa S.A.

This warranty is only applicable to Torrot Electric electric vehicles and bicycles purchased new from an authorised Torrot Electric Europa S.L. dealer or directly from the manufacturer via its website and which have been assembled by the said dealer or the manufacturer at the time of purchase. This warranty does not cover

unauthorised parts or their installation by companies not expressly authorised by Torrot Electric Europa S.L.

LIMITED REPAIR

Unless decided otherwise, the only repair under the abovementioned warranty, or any implicit warranty, is limited to replacing defective parts for others of equal or greater value in the original vehicle, which is entirely at Torrot Electric's discretion. This warranty applies from the date of purchase and is applicable only to the original owner and is non-transferable, except for the MUVI electric scooter (see warranty transfer section).

Any claim under this warranty must be filed through an authorized Torrot Electric dealer or directly online or by postal mail to Torrot Electric Europe S.A. Warranty claims filed outside the country of purchase may be subject to additional fees and restrictions, and unless otherwise stated shall be covered solely and directly by the importer in the country or region outside Spain.

The term and details of the warranty may vary depending on the type of vehicle, battery and/or the country. This warranty grants specific legal rights; however, you may also have other rights that may vary by place. This warranty does not affect the rights established by the law.

ONLINE WARRANTY REGISTRATION

To validate and activate the warranty, the vehicle must be registered by the dealer or importer.

WARRANTY TRANSFER (ONLY MUVI)

The transfer of the warranty shall apply to the new user when they show they have concluded the change of ownership of the vehicle according to laws in force in each country, binds the manufacturer in Spain and the importer in all other countries.
